New Business:

Appointment of New Director

Motion to approve the appointment of Laverne Mann as the new Executive Director of Hamilton Township Public Library. Motion by Ms. Tonti; 2nd by Ms. Vigh

Roll Call Vote: Ms. Kerlin, yes; Ms. DeAngelo, yes; Mr. Santamaria, yes; Mr. Stevenson, yes; Ms. Vigh, yes; Ms. Rogers, yes; Ms. Tonti, yes; approved unanimously.

Ms. Mann was welcomed by the Executive Board and the public.

Review and Consideration of the Minutes of the previous meeting (July 2025) Amended to correct Friend's to Friends and accepted with abstentions from Ms. Rogers and Ms. DeAngelo.

Consideration of the Treasurer's Report August: moved by Ms. Rogers 2ns by Ms. DeAngelo approved unanimously. <u>September:</u> Mr. Santamaria had a question on the postage line item. Mr. Stevenson had a question on the number of employees covered by the insurance plan. (All employees, present active as well as retired are covered by our self insured policy.) Ms. Rogers had a question on the ERATE being a higher reimbursement than expected. Ms. Affrime confirmed that yes, ERATE is currently higher than past years. Motion to accept by Ms. Vigh, 2nd by Mr. Santamaria; approved unanimously.

Consideration of the Library Bill List <u>August:</u> Mr. Cimino asked if our electricity is bill through the township? Is our electricity bill currently rising higher than anticipated? Ms. Affrime stated yes, it has gone up significantly. Ms. Kerlin stated we believe we have planned for the expected increase and may squeeze through this year's budget. Motion to approve motion by Ms. Tonti, 2nd by Mr. Stevenson; passed unanimously. <u>September:</u> Ms. DeAngelo asked about the Baker and Taylor Books line. Is this a normal amount? Ms. Affrime stated that orders are placed throughout the year. The library is not billed until the books are shipped. Ms. Affrime also shared that Baker and Taylor was also recently sold as a company, so some changes in the future could be expected. Motion to approve Ms. DeAngelo; 2nd Mr. Santamaria; approved unanimously.

Summer Reading Highlights – As a part of Summer Reading the children's department held 71 programs for 2,974 people. The surprise hit of the summer was our carnival which attracted 334 people over two days. On Tuesday evening 8/12 the focus was on making crafts and winning tickets playing traditional games like ring toss, topple the cans, ball toss and bean bag throw. The tickets could then be redeemed for prizes collected throughout the year from library donations. Wednesday morning the focus was more on fun for little kids - playing games, taking pictures, face painting. Both events featured walk about performances from magician Bill Kerwood. Apparently, people really enjoyed it last year and told their griends. One parent said their kid was having more fun than they did at the St. Greg's carnival!
